

What Have We Done With Your Money?



Your donations for 2002 totaled \$13,161.55.

Experts say the way to tell whether a charity is a good one is to look at the amount of contributions that go to administrative expenses (10% is considered exceptionally low) and the commitment of the Board of Directors.

Only \$381.00 of your donations this year went to administrative expenses, that's only 2.9% of the total funds received. The Board of Directors and Advisory Board members contributed an additional \$3,000.00+ for other expenses and fees.

500.00 Repair the roof and windows of the Baptist Church in Gaza which was hit by an Israeli missile.

Egypt:

\$250.00 To the Coptic Orphans Organization.

Sudan:

\$500.00 To the Christians via The Voice of the Martyrs.

Total distribution in 2002: \$9,500.00

They remain, for the time being, far away from our shores. But for those determined to obey Scripture, the choice is clear. Did You Know...

- The Arabic language today is the language of the Christian Arabs. They were the pioneers of the 18, 19, and 20th centuries of Arabic literature.
- The first Arab printing machine in the Arab world was created in Saint John Choueir convent in Lebanon in 1735 by a Christian Syrian, Abdallah Zakher.
- The first college in the Arab world was opened in 1789 in Ain Waraka, Lebanon by the Maronite monks.
- The first universities in the Arab world were the American University and the Catholic University of St. Joseph. Both are located in Beirut, Lebanon.
- The famous Egyptian news paper Al-Ahram was founded in Alexandria in 1825, and in Cairo in 1895 by two Lebanese Christians brothers, Salim and Bechara Takla.
